

Secondary Georgraphy Teacher, Part-time (approx 0.6) Role Statement

Experience in teaching Geography to the HSC, along with interest in and the ability to teach Geography for the IB, are also desirable. He/she should have a strong in-depth knowledge of current NSW Geography syllabuses and have demonstrated the ability to maximise student performance. He/she should be able to use ICT effectively in the classroom to enhance and promote learning.

The position requires a teacher who has an enthusiastic approach to teaching young women and who is committed to engaging students in learning. We are looking for a talented teacher who has the ability to inspire students to love the subject and to think about the world around them.

Highly effective communication, effective teaching strategies, a good academic record and a natural rapport with staff and students are desirable qualities, as well as a commitment to ongoing professional development. The successful applicant would be a team player who is keen to share his/her expertise with colleagues and work together to further develop and implement effective programs that meet the needs of individual students.
